










Citation Statistics by Academic Year



Case Log and Board Results



2023 Annual Program Review: January-April 2023 RC Meetings

Written 5th
Percentile 20202022 = 66.67%

10 programs failed

Oral 5th percentile 2019-2021 = 47.5%

1 programs failed

1 of 10 programs failed both the oral and written boards.




Report Form for Institutional Data



Dedicated Time – Program Coordinator

 Dedicated time changes for program coordinator took effect 7/1/22


II.C.2.	II.C.2. The program coordinator must be provided with dedicated time and support adequate for administration of the program based upon its size and configuration. (Core)	
II.C.2.a)	The program coordinator must be provided with support equal to a dedicated minimum of 50 percent FTE for administration of the program. (Core)	



RC assessment tips for AY22-23

- Non-compliance with dedicated time changes:
 - o 1st year citation will be issued if non-compliant
- Resident and Faculty Survey results
 - Participation in adverse events (themes)
- Specialty-specific block diagram
 - 1st year citation will be issued if template isn't used or at minimum approved content is not provided.
- Program Director Oversight/Failure to Provide Accurate Information
 - ADS annual update (ex. Faculty Roster)
